Safety Week is Coming...

The first week back after half term (Monday 1st November) will be Child safety week, which is also an annual community education campaign run by the Child Accident Prevention Trust at a different point in the year. During this week, we will be reminding the children how to keep themselves safe and who they can talk to if they feel unsafe in anyway. We will be linking this to the Unicef Convention of Children's Rights:

Article 3 (best interests of the child)

The best interests of the child must be a top priority in all decisions and actions that affect children.

Article 5 (parental guidance and a child's evolving capacities)

Rights and responsibilities of parents and carers to provide guidance and direction to their child as they grow up, so that they fully enjoy their rights. This must be done in a way that recognises the child's increasing capacity to make their own choices.

Article 6 (life, survival, and development)

Every child has the right to life. We must do all we can to ensure that children survive and develop to their full potential.

Article 19 (protection from violence, abuse, and neglect)

Governments must do all they can to ensure that children are protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect, and bad treatment by anyone who looks after them.

Article 24 (health and health services)

Every child has the right to the best possible health. We must provide education on health and well-being so that children can stay healthy.

Article 29 (goals of education)

Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.

We will be covering topics on Fire safety, road safety, online safety, and stranger safety. We will also be covering some sessions on COP26 (climate change) as this protects our children's future. All this work is alongside the regular curriculum for health and safety that we teach weekly through PHSE and RHE.

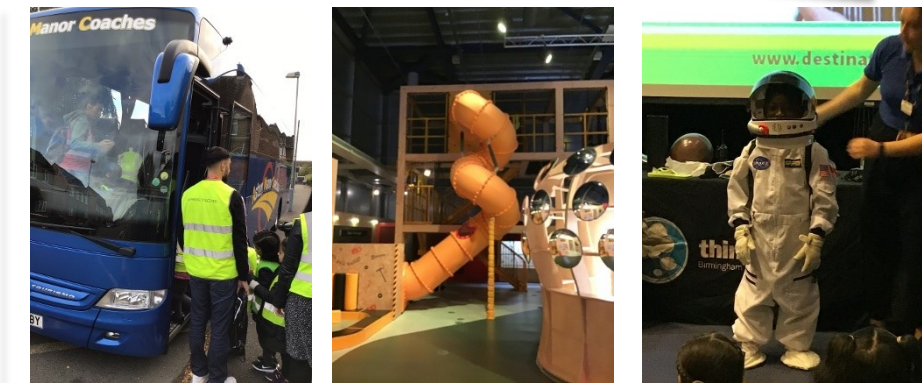
