Sometimes it can seem like cyber bullying will never end. But there are some things you can do to make it stop.

Nobody has to go through online bullying alone. Telling someone you trust could help you report the cyber bullying and give you more confidence to deal with the situation. You could talk to a friend, an adult you trust or one of our trained counsellors.

Cyber bullying is not against the law, but harassment or threatening behaviour is. That means if someone keeps making you feel scared on purpose, what they're doing could be illegal.

If someone's bullying or threatening you, something can be done to stop them and you should report it to an adult you trust. If you can, keep a record of the bullying. Having a record of when and where the bullying happened can help to get it stopped.

WhatsApp

Sending abusive, nasty or threatening text messages to someone is a type of bullying. This could include sharing those texts with other people who might join in the bullying.

Online Gaming

If someone is constantly targeting you in a game, or being abusive towards you then that's a type of bullying. People could also try to steal your belongings or hack into your account.

Childline is a service to support children with a range of issues, not just cyber bullying. Bullying, the law, bodies, friendships, relationships, abuse, safety, feelings, families and school are all areas that Childline can offer support in.
