Next term, on our first day back (Tuesday 5th January) the Life Education Centre will be visiting St. Clement's for the day. The life educators will be visiting KS2 and covering the following topics:

Life Education West Midlands

Year 3 - Talented Brain

Children will learn about the brain and nervous system; and begin to think about how it works and what can keep the brain and body healthy.

Year 4 - Choices

Children will learn about body organs and how unique we all are. Personal choice is examined, including taking responsibility for their own safety and behaviour.

Year 5 - You Choose

This session explores tobacco, smoking facts, society's attitudes towards smoking, assertiveness skills and risky situations. This is done through discussion, watching and listening to audio/film and drama activities. The use of interactive voting technology handsets (Quizdom), will allow pupils to explore the law, physical effects of smoking, and normative behaviour around smoking.

Year 6 – Decisions

This session helps pupils to explore the risks and effects of drugs – legal and illegal, the messages and attitudes surrounding drugs, including alcohol in our society and the subject of peer influence. Through discussion, the use of interactive technology (Quizdom) and drama activities, pupils consider how these attitudes can affect young people's decisions around alcohol and other risky situations and other alternatives.

End of the Day – Assembly and Parent/Carer Q & A

Parents are welcome to attend assembly at 2:45pm which will reinforce the importance of being healthy. After the assembly tea and coffee will be provided and an opportunity for parents/carers to discuss any concerns they may have with the health educators.


