This week has been packed full of a variety of activities where each class chose a book to look at and study in connection with different aspects of the curriculum. Linking into all core subjects through investigations, experiments and more. You can find out more about some classes activities below



Year Two have taken part in lots of fun activities this week based around the fiction book, 'The Magic Paintbrush' by Julia Donaldson. Shen, the main character within the story watches her paintings come to life before her very eyes. Shen decides to show her kindness and help the poor villagers through each and every painting! Year Two reflected upon this and designed and created their very own magic paintbrushes and thought about things that they could paint and wished would come to life in order to help the poor villagers from the book, just like Shen. The children also wrote extended captions to go with their paintings. The highlight of book week was visiting the new Library of Birmingham where the children were given the opportunity to read and share a variety of books, as well as learn about how they could borrow books from the library. What a wonderful way to end our half term!

Year Five have been looking at Gulliver's travels by Johnathan Swift during book week. We have made scale Lilliputians and a Gulliver, we used our knowledge of scaling up and down in maths. We also had fun making origami boats of different sizes and testing them out. We discussed what modifications we could make to help them float better and then tried them out in water with different weights - not all of them did so well at keeping afloat!









