

Safeguarding: Staying Safe in the Community

Children should be able to go outside and enjoy their community - but not without knowing how to stay safe. Even in the safest of neighbourhoods, dangers exist. From being aware of strangers and other dangerous activities, to learning how to stay safe while riding bikes and playing outside, children must stay alert and understand what it takes to stay safe. Parents can help their children stay safe by going over basic rules and safety tips, as well as helping them get to know the ins and outs of their neighbourhood.

One of the first steps to staying safe in the community is learning more about your area. Who are your neighbours? Where is it okay to play? What do you need to watch out for? When children have a better understanding of the area they live in, they not only feel safer, but they notice when things do not seem right and know what to do when problems arise.

In Nechells there are several parks for children to play, explore and have fun with their friends. There are also dangers such as, building sites, canals and train lines, which are not safe places for children to play or 'hang around'. Make sure you talk to your children about their community and help them stay safe.

Wishing you a peaceful Easter and see you in two weeks.


